Planning Priority #1: Indigenous Perspectives and Understanding - By June 2022, all students and staff will know and understand the importance of our school Land Acknowledgement and gain a larger appreciation of Indigenous cultures of Canada.

Strategies:

- The LES school specific Land Acknowledgement will be read once a week as part of the morning school announcements.
- School wide virtual assemblies will take place once a week to build our collective understanding of the importance of our Land Acknowledgment.
- The assemblies will incorporate Indegenous music and literature.

Planning Priority #2: Social Emotional Learning - By June 2022, all students will have developed an increase in their use of self-regulation strategies to support their well-being and learning.

Strategies:

- Staff and students will be able to identify when they are dysregulated and identify strategies for self and co-regulation.
- ♦ Bottom line behaviours will be analyzed through a self-regulation five step framework. Data will drive the next step.
- Our guidance counselors will teach in class lessons that build on student's awareness and application of self regulation strategies.
- Build our collective understanding of anxiety and how to support students and families coping with worry and anxiety.

Planning Priority #3: Literacy Continuous Improvement Plan - By June 2022, all students will show growth in reading.

Strategies:

- School literacy data will be used to set realistic and measurable goals and guide support for literacy intervention.
- School-based and divisional literacy support teams will work together with classroom teachers to provide intervention strategies.
- All teachers will receive Professional Development in the area of reading instruction.
- A K-4 school focus on the development of students' phonological skills

Planning Priority #4: Numeracy - By June 2022, all students will show growth in their Number Sense.

Strategies:

- Grade 4/5K, 5/6A and 5/6H will be part of the HSD Divisional Numeracy Achievement project.
- Through Number Talks students will build their mathematical reasoning and ability to communicate their knowledge of mathematical concepts.
- Staff will be provided with PD opportunities to build their strategies for classroom Number Talks
