Strategies:

- The LES school specific Land Acknowledgement was read at school wide assemblies.
- School wide virtual assemblies took place once a week to build our collective understanding of the importance of our Land Acknowledgment.
- Assemblies incorporated Indegenous music and literature.
- Students and staff reflected on the importance of our Land Acknowledgement.

Planning Priority #2: Social Emotional Learning - By June 2022, all students will have developed an increase in their use of self-regulation strategies to support their well-being and learning.

Strategies:

- Staff participated in PD on understanding and supporting students with worrying and anxiety.
- School wide bottom line data was examined and used to identify next steps for support for these students.
- All classes received in class guidance education Kimochis, Thrival Kits and Zones of Regulation.
- School wide playground norms were established.

Planning Priority #3: Literacy Continuous Improvement Plan - By June 2022, all students will show growth in reading.

Strategies:

- School literacy data was used to set realistic and measurable goals and guide support for literacy intervention.
- School-based and divisional literacy support teams worked together with classroom teachers to provide intervention strategies.
- ❖ A K-4 school focus on the development of students' phonological skills.
- Decodable and leveled books were purchased for the school Literacy Lab to support guided reading and literacy intervention.

Planning Priority #4: Numeracy - By June 2022, all students will show growth in their Number Sense.

Strategies:

- Grade 4/5K, 5/6A and 5/6H participated in the HSD Divisional Numeracy Achievement project.
- Through Number Talks students built their mathematical reasoning and ability to communicate their knowledge of mathematical concepts.
- Staff participated in Graham Fletcher PD on K-2 Numerical Reasoning and Foundations of Fractions.
