Planning Priority: Social/Emotional Learning - By June, 2024, students will contribute positively to their own learning, the learning of their classmates and feel empowered to make positive contributions to the school community.

Strategies:

- House Group activities focused on developing and reflecting on Character skills through STEAM activities.
- Students will share their learning on a regular basis with classmates, within the school and families through SEESAW posts and other mediums.
- Celebration of Learning event in March.
- Opportunities to celebrate and share our cultural diversity.
- Cross grade level buddies.

Planning Priority: Indigenous Perspectives and Understanding -By June 2024, all students and staff will continue to learn about the Indigenous peoples of Canada.

Strategies:

- Continue to develop partnerships with Indigenous persons/communities.
- Being exposed to Indigenous languages.
- A continuation of learning about the Seven Teachings.
- A Land Acknowledgement will be read as part of morning announcements, assemblies and school community events.

Planning Priority: Literacy Continuous Improvement Plan - By June 2024, all students will show growth in writing and reading.

Strategies:

- Writing samples will be collected three times a year and used to develop consistent grade level expectations.
- Track individual students' reading progress that are of concern throughout the year. This information will guide the literacy support provided to individuals and groups of students.
- Strengthen the partnership with home to continue practicing reading skills learned at school.

Planning Priority: By June 2024, all students will show a year's worth of growth in numeracy (each grade will focus on a specific math goal). Strategies:

 School wide Numeracy data is analyzed to look at the foundational outcomes for each grade level and teacher PD is provided to show growth in the identified outcomes.

- A school wide focus on understanding fractions and number operations.
- Students develop their mathematical reasoning by communicating their ideas with others.
